UNICEF

This week in school we have been focusing on **Article 28** of the Convention on the Rights of a Child: 'Every child has the right to an education.'

Our steering group met this week to create a 'Visitor Charter' which outlines the responsibilities of visitors to our school. This charter is now displayed in the foyer by the school office on our UNICEF board. Our steering group have also ordered new blue caps which will replace the current 'yellow caps'. These are currently worn by some Key Stage 2 children when supporting children in the infant playground during lunchtimes. These 'yellow cap' children will now be known as 'Peer Mediators' and their role will be of a similar nature to their current one. This includes creating games for the younger children and trying to help them solve any friendship disagreements they may have.
