

School Improvement

With Reading progress and attainment continuing to be such a high priority across our school our Recovery Curriculum Plan reflects this. I am delighted to inform you that we secured Trust funding for a new charging trolley and 30 new iPads to enable our Accelerated Reader quizzes and start tests to be undertaken more regularly. These are already in use LOTS throughout KS2 daily.



The staff and children are delighted about this.

Obviously we are tracking the children's reading very closely to see where there are gaps in learning and to find ways to accelerate their progress and love of literature. This starts from day one in Pre-school with Read, Write, Inc. phonics and continues through early reading skills, comprehension work, book talk, intervention support and guided reading....learning to read so they can read to learn.



I am delighted to say that since September when we did an Accelerated Reader baseline assessment of the children from Y2 –Y6 the 'mean' progress of each class has been +5 months-not bad for a 2 month period! Thank you for all your continued support at home-the value of reading with your children cannot be overestimated.
