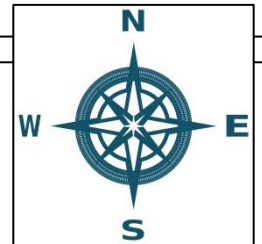

Did you know?

Cornwall is the most southwest county of Great Britain.

Cornwall is surrounded by the English Channel and the Celtic Sea.

The name Cornwall originates from the words "Cornovii" and "Waelas," meaning hill dwellers and strangers.

Cornwall has the longest coastline of any English county, measuring almost 700 km. It has about 300 beaches, some of which have 8 metre high waves and are popular with surfers.

Cornwall is the only county in England bordered by only one other county, Devon

The population of the county is 535,300.

The highest point in Cornwall is Brown Willy, located on Bodmin moor.

Cornwall is the location of Great Britain's most southerly point, The Lizard, and the southern mainland's most westerly point, Land's End

Truro is the only city in Cornwall.

Launceston was once the capital of Cornwall

Compared to the rest of Britain, Cornwall has relatively warm and sunny weather

Land's End is Cornwall's most westerly point, and many people have walked the 1,340 km from here to John O'Groats in Scotland.
