Dear Parents/Carers,

A very warm welcome back to the Autumn Term –I do hope you managed to have some sunny days over the holiday and enjoy some relaxing family time with your children. A special 'Team St Stephens' welcome to the new Reception class joining us this term and also the new pupils across the school. As in true St Stephens style we have started the term with 'gusto' and our new whole school theme "**Community and Inheritance**' has involved trips into the local community and visitors in to engage the children's curiosity from the onset. Please keep checking your child's

classroom blog on the website under the heading 'Children' so you can share all their enrichment and class based learning. At the end of last term each child from Y1-Y6 was sent home with a **knowledge organiser** and **vocabulary word mat** that will be key for the work being taught at the beginning of this term. In this first week we've be finding out what they know and adapting our planning to deepen and extend that knowledge. Each class will have several 'topics' or 'lines of enquiry' under the whole school theme each term — approx. 4 weeks long. Each time a new 'topic' is started a new knowledge organiser and vocabulary mat will be sent home for you to support your child with their learning. These can also be accessed under your child's class information tab on the website just in case any get lost in bags! Each class also produces a **termly curriculum overview** that you should have received – please ask your child's class teacher if you have not received one as yet. We are trialling a new format this term that we hope will support you with ways to help at home, we know how important our partnership with you is to enable your child to flourish.

Please make sure you have seen the clubs we have on offer this term-we do try to offer something for everyone across the year –so please sign up if you haven't already done so. With that said please consider if your child is ready for after school commitments– I know last year several of the Reception children were simply too tired at the end of a school day to fully participate in this first school term.

I have enjoyed catching up with many of you at the school gate in the morning and around the school .Please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any concerns, queries or ideas for our wonderful school-my door is always open.

Inheritance knowledge

Year 6 launched their learning in Science this week with two fantastic visits from Sharon at Ancient Art Falconry. Five different birds of prey visited us: a Little Owl, a Barn Owl, a Tawny Owl, a Harris Hawk and a Kestrel. By the end of the two days the children were



able to classify them into different species through considering their different characteristics. They also learnt about the anatomy of the birds of prey and how the Harris Hawk has evolved from a dinosaur - the Tetragon. They even got to dissect pellets to discover what the birds had been eating!

This is an issue that we at St Stephens take extremely seriously and we understand our responsibility to the children and staff. I would like to reassure you that we are constantly reviewing our process and systems for the management of allergens and the prevention of allergy incidents. With this in mind I would like to request that

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS SHOULD NOT BE **BROUGHT INTO SCHOOL:**

- Packs of nuts.
- Peanut butter sandwiches
- Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts
- Sesame seed rolls (Children allergic to nuts may also have a severe reaction to sesame)
- Cakes made with nuts.

We really appreciate your support with this and apologise if your child cannot have a favourite healthy snack at school -they can have them at home obviously. Our 'Allergy Aware School' policy needs everyone to be alert to the dangers that may have life changing implications for our pupils and staff.

Please also remember to update the office of any medical changes for your child and keep any medication left in school regularly updated.


