We feel our child is not being significantly challenged in reading and books are not being changed daily as agreed. We also feel the changes to Read Write Inc and lack of spelling test will have an effect on standards” (Class 2 parent)
How will the academy address parental concerns?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Changes to the delivery of the English curriculum are partly due to the increased expectations of the National Curriculum. • The Head of School will carefully monitor changes to the learning and delivery of the curriculum – particularly at Key Stage 1. This will ensure that pupils continue to achieve well throughout the year. • All staff have been fully trained before any significant changes are made to learning and curriculum delivery and this will continue over the course of the Autumn 15 and Spring 16 terms.
