Absence

We are reaching the end of term where we will be celebrating high attendance for the term and whole year.

Did you know that if your child has attendance for the year of 90% they will have been absent for 19 days of school, that's almost four weeks! That's a lot of learning and social time that they will have missed out on and research shows that attendance below 95% may effect a pupil's educational outcomes, for example the grades they get at GCSE level!

Aiming to keep your child's attendance above 95% will help them succeed at school and beyond, so please support your child in achieving the best attendance they can.

<u>Visit Payments– Events will be cancelled if we do not have enough</u> <u>money</u>

Please note that due to government funding cuts we cannot support trips and events next year. All money will have to be in two weeks before an events e,g, trip or residential. Without enough funds the trip will be cancelled. Whist we acknowledge trip payments are a donation we cannot afford to run trips without these contributions. If you would like to your child and class to take part in events please ensure that you pay. Please note that the pre school, breakfast club or school meal payments have to be made and we can issue payment warnings for this and take legal proceedings. Finally, please note that after school clubs will most likely have a payment to cover the adult leading the event in future. We will have more information on this next year.

In order to ensure that people cannot track your child's location they need to enable the feature in 'Ghost Mode' this will ensure that it is not public information. Like with any social media app or feature we strongly advise parents to watch your child's use of technology and ensure safe and sensible use.

How to switch off Snap Map location sharing



When in photo-taking mode, pinch the screen to open Snap Map

Touch the settings cog in the top right corner of the screen

Tap "Ghost Mode" to switch off location sharing

Photos and videos posted to Snapchat's public 'Our Story' will still be discoverable on the map
