St Stephens is a great school and I am proud to be associated with it.




Peter Jones (Co-opted Governor & Vice Chair of Governors)

During their time at St Stephens, I have been very involved in offering support as a volunteer. In 2015, I decided to become a committee member on the Academy's PTFA, as I wanted to help raise funds for opportunities and equipment that would help enhance their learning experiences. I am now Chair of the PTFA and work closely with many members of the Academy to provide valuable activities and experiences within the school. What do your governors do?


Overview
