School Improvement

I'm finding it very hard to get excited by school heating in the current climate however I know that when autumn and winter come it will be a joy to have a system that works efficiently and keeps the school toasty warm! At the last meeting the contractors and building leads have informed us that the work is all on schedule and we hope for them all to be off site after the summer holidays.



This will then make room for exciting work being done outside in the playgrounds! We were very fortunate to secure Lottery Funding (£10,000) to build a permanent shelter in the KS1 area and erect a large sail for shelter in the KS2 area. The aim is to ensure there is somewhere to keep out of the rain or sun and to enable groups of people to meet during after school clubs or for people in the community to meet for different events. I know the children will make very good use of them during the school day also. The start day for the building works is 6th September 2021... so look out for more updates!

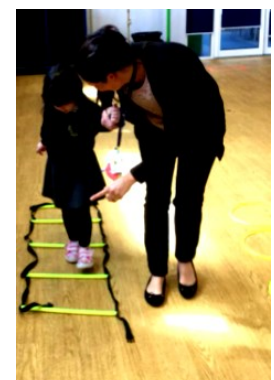
The Sports Project

Master Bakers

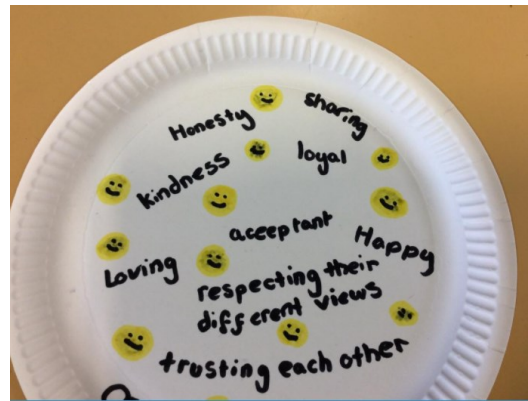

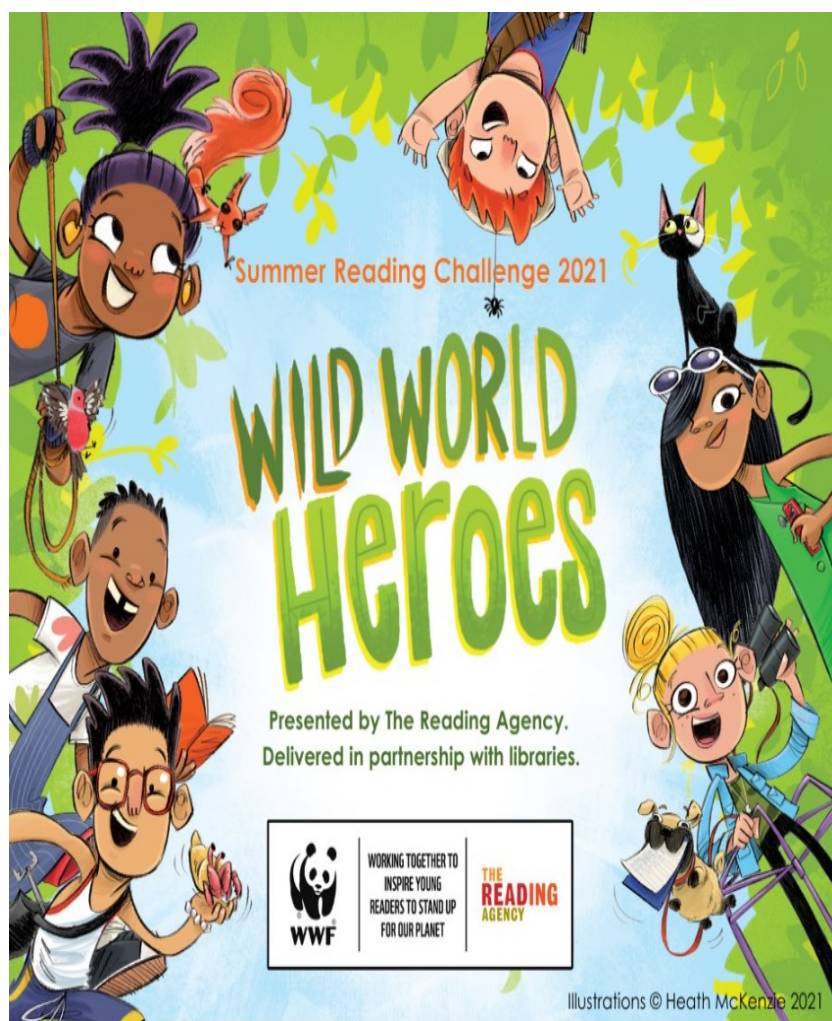
It was with great excitement that we drew a winning ticket from each class 100% box at our WHOLE SCHOOL final assembly on the last day-all together as a team in our school grounds.
