School Improvement @Team St Stephens

We are immensely proud of everything the children and staff have achieved this year despite the challenges we have all faced and continue to do so. That said we have already started to analyse what has worked well and what our next improvement steps will be. Our Academy Improvement Plan (AIP) will be available in September after an internal School Evaluation Plan (SEF). Already we know that Writing will be a school priority to further embed good teaching strategies and showcase our reading drive. Ensuring that all pupils, irrespective of their individual needs, achieve and make good progress in all subjects will also be key. We have the same high expectation for all children, we recognise they have different strengths and different needs- just like us as adults! Our curriculum offer will also be honed and reviewed to ensure the children have an equal balance of knowledge and skills in all the curriculum areas. Our Governors will be focussing on our pupils' voice and supporting, whilst challenging, the school to ensure we provide the very best we can for your children.



Year 3 and 4 Wild Tribe Activity Day with Arena Sports.

Throughout the day, we completed three activities - Wild Maths, Wild Science and Wild Art.

Wild Maths allowed us to consolidate our shape learning by looking at the properties of 2D shapes. We then created out own dreamcatchers using sticks, wire and natural resources that we found on our school site.





Wild Science explored the exciting themes of Fossils and Volcanoes. This linked fantastically with the Geography and Science topics that the children have explored this year.

Finally, Wild Art explored the work of Andy Goldsworthy. In pairs, or small groups, the children had to design and create their own piece of art work. Each pair/group had to plan their piece of art work before forage for their materials. A true test of our relationships and leadership skills.

The activities tested our resilience, communication, creativity and planning and problem solving skills.

The day ended with toasting marshmallows over the fire - which was a fantastic opportunity to apply the skills that we learned at the Woodland Skills Centre a few weeks ago.
