School Improvement

Across the Multi Academy Trust (MAT) we have invested time and training to introduce 'Lockdown' procedures in our schools. Over the next few weeks we shall be having a lockdown drill at St Stephens following our plan. We will regularly test this plan. The children will be taught what to do if the school has to be 'locked down' because we need to keep them safe. There are several reasons why this may happen e.g. a gas leak at a local factory or a reported incident/civil disturbance in the local community (with the potential to pose a risk to staff and pupils in the school). Please be reassured that the school understands your concern for your child's welfare and that everything that can possibly be done to ensure the children's safety will be done. It is also vital to reinforce the message that when the school is in a full lockdown situation the switchboard and entrances will be un-manned, external doors locked and nobody is allowed in or out. Should parents present at the school during a lockdown under no circumstances will members of staff leave the building to communicate directly with them-including a practice drill. Our plan will be practiced in a calm and orderly manner, the priority is to keep the chil-





dren safe and this will be a routine exercise just like our termly fire drills. If you have any questions please make an appointment to come and see me.






